**HB 0001D**    **Property Insurance** by Trumbull

Property Insurance: Creating the Reinsurance to Assist Policyholders program to be administered by the SBA; requiring certain property insurers to obtain coverage under the program; adding a requirement for hurricane mitigation inspection applications; requiring claimants to establish that property insurers have breached the insurance contract to prevail in certain claims for damages; requiring the OIR to aggregate on a statewide basis and make publicly available data submitted by insurers and insurer groups, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

**SB 0002D**    **Property Insurance** by Boyd

Property Insurance; Creating the Reinsurance to Assist Policyholders program to be administered by the State Board of Administration; requiring certain property insurers to obtain coverage under the program; adding a requirement for hurricane mitigation inspection applications; requiring claimants to establish that property insurers have breached the insurance contract to prevail in certain claims for damages; requiring the Office of Insurance Regulation to aggregate on a statewide basis and make publicly available certain data submitted by insurers and insurer groups, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

**HB 0003D**    **Roof Repair, Replacement, and Recovering Requirements** by Trumbull

Roof Repair, Replacement, and Recovering Requirements: Providing roofing system or roof section of certain existing buildings or structures does not have to be repaired, replaced, or recovered in accordance with the Florida Building Code under certain circumstances; requiring the Florida Building Commission to adopt rules and incorporate the rules into the building code; prohibiting local governments from adopting certain administrative or technical amendments to the building code. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**SB 0004D**    **Roof Repair, Replacement, and Recovering Requirements** by Boyd

Roof Repair, Replacement, and Recovering Requirements; Providing that the entire roofing system or roof section of certain existing buildings or structures does not have to be repaired, replaced, or recovered in accordance with the Florida Building Code under certain circumstances; requiring the Florida Building Commission to adopt rules and incorporate the rules into the building code; prohibiting local governments from adopting certain administrative or technical amendments to the building code, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

**HB 0011D**    **Insurance** by Gottlieb

Insurance: Revises calculation of amount of losses below which insurer is not entitled to reimbursement from FHCF for certain contract years; requires formula for determining actuarially indicated premiums to include cash build-up factor in certain contract years; authorizes insurers to file certain insurance rating plans based on certain windstorm mitigation construction standards under certain circumstances; revises conditions for determining ineligibility of condominiums for wind-only coverage; authorizes licensed personal lines or general lines agents to solicit, negotiate, advertise, or sell motor vehicle service agreements, home warranty contracts, & service warranty contracts without sales representative license. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2022

**HB 0013D Studies Concerning Coverage for Personal Lines Residential Structures** by Bartleman

Studies Concerning Coverage for Personal Lines Residential Structures: Requires OIR to conduct studies concerning coverage for personal lines residential structures; provides reporting requirements. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**HB 0015D Homeowners' Insurance Policies** by Hinson

Homeowners' Insurance Policies: Provides requirement for property insurers before insurers may require certain property replacements as condition of issuance or renewal of homeowners' insurance policies; prohibits property insurers from refusing to issue or renew policies unless specified requirements are met. Effective Date: July 1, 2022

**HB 0017D Annual Conference for Property Insurers** by Hinson

Annual Conference for Property Insurers: Requires DFS & OIR of Financial Services Commission to hold annual conference focusing on certain topics; requires certain insurers to attend such conference. Effective Date: July 1, 2022

**HB 0019D Building Code Requirements for Roof Repair** by Hart

Building Code Requirements for Roof Repair: Provides that Florida Building Code may not require entire roofing system or roof section of certain existing buildings or structures to be repaired, replaced, or recovered to meet Florida Building Code; provides requirements for Florida Building Commission. Effective Date: July 1, 2022

**SB 0020D Studies Concerning Coverage for Personal Lines Residential Structures** by Book

Studies Concerning Coverage for Personal Lines Residential Structures; Requiring the Office of Insurance Regulation to conduct studies concerning coverage for personal lines residential structures; providing reporting requirements; providing for expiration, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

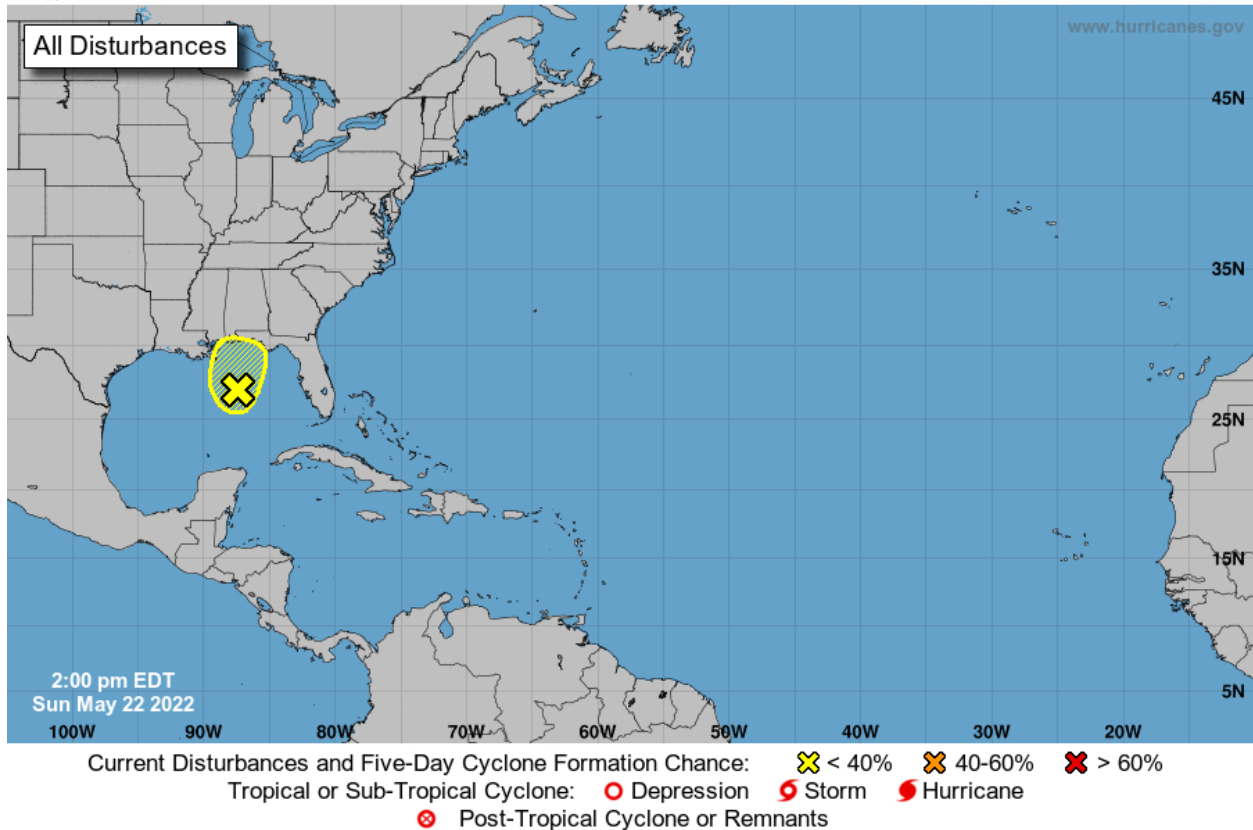

- **PINELLAS ELECTIONS CASE HEARD:** Leon County Circuit Judge John Cooper will hear arguments in a constitutional challenge to part of a new state law that would make changes in the election of Pinellas County commissioners. Cooper will consider Pinellas County’s request for a preliminary injunction to block the changes, along with motions by the state to dismiss the case. Pinellas County attorneys filed the lawsuit April 29 to challenge a section of a broad elections law that they contend would improperly apply only to Pinellas County and would require elections this year for two county-commission seats that otherwise would not come up for election until 2024. The lawsuit alleges, in part, that the challenged part of the measure is what is known as an unconstitutional “special law” because it would effectively apply only to Pinellas County.
