#### **U.S. Supreme Court overturn Roe vs. Wade – 6-3**

#### **Governor DeSantis Backs Local Governments with Veto of SB 620**

SB 620 would have caused significant impact on local government ability to protect the local community and would have been costly to the taxpayers.

#### **Governor Vetoes Bill modifying Divorce and Alimony Laws**

DeSantis' veto letter stated that it was his view that the Legislature's proposal is unconstitutional. "If (SB 1796) were to become law and be given retroactive effect as the Legislature intends, it would unconstitutionally impair vested rights under certain preexisting marital settlement agreements."

#### **State Fiscal Year starts Friday – Budget and New Laws will take effect**

A record \$109.9 billion state budget will take effect with the July 1 start of the state's 2022-2023 fiscal year. At the same time, dozens of new laws will take effect, including some of the highest-profile measures passed this year.

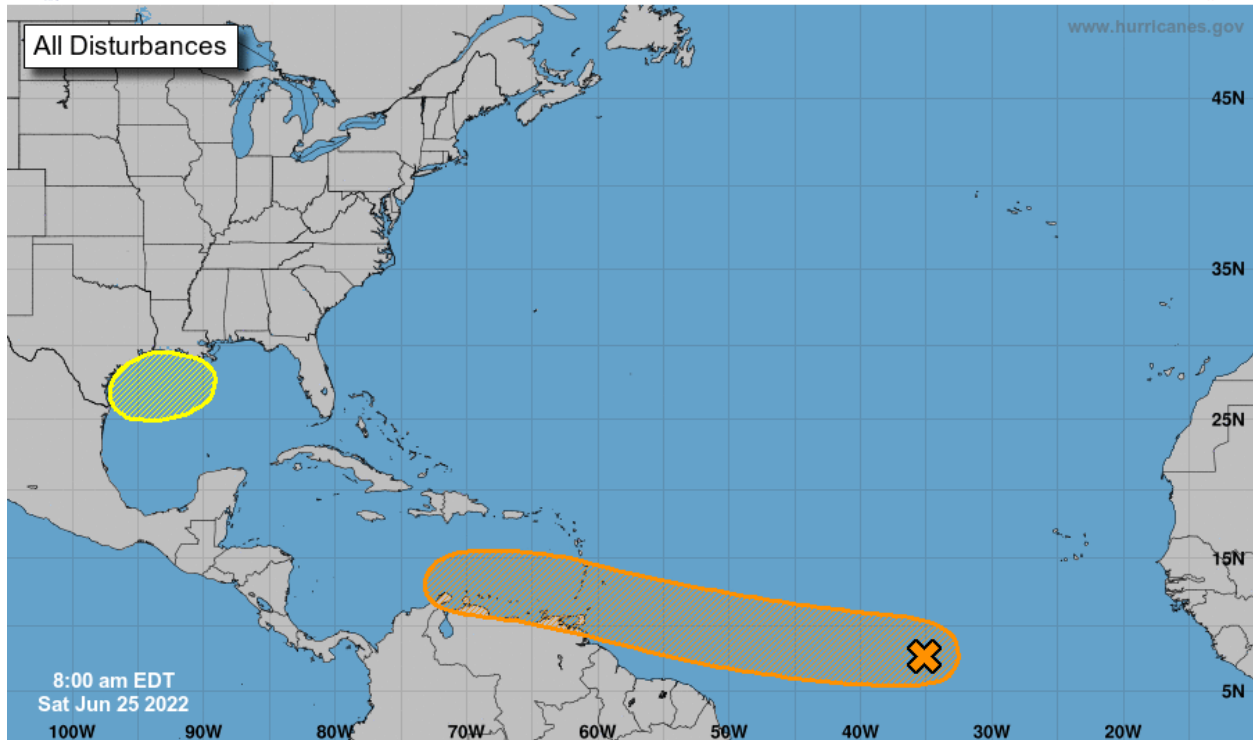

- BUDGET, LAWS TAKE EFFECT: A record \$109.9 billion state budget for the 2022-2023 fiscal year will take effect, along with numerous new state laws.
- MUNIZ BECOMES CHIEF JUSTICE: Florida Supreme Court Justice Carlos Muniz will begin a two-year term as chief justice. Muniz will succeed Chief Justice Charles Canady, who will remain on the court.
- 'FREEDOM WEEK' BEGINS: The state will start a "Freedom Week" sales-tax holiday that will allow people to avoid paying sales taxes on a variety of purchases involving entertainment and recreation. For example, they will not have to pay sales taxes on tickets to movies and sporting events and on many types of boating, camping and fishing supplies. The holiday will last through July 7.
- POST-SESSION 'OUTLOOKS': The Revenue Estimating Conference will discuss post-legislative session "outlooks" about general revenue and the education-enhancement, tobacco-settlement and state-school trust funds. (Friday, 9:30 a.m., 117 Knott Building, the Capitol.)
