Senator Ausley draws Opponent - Former FSU and NFL Football Star

Former Florida State University and NFL football player Corey Simon will try to unseat Sen. Loranne Ausley, D-Tallahassee, in November. Simon who filed paperwork Monday to run in Senate District 3. was an All-American defensive tackle at Florida State before playing eight years in the NFL. Ausley, a former House member, was elected to the Senate in 2020 receiving 53.4 percent of the vote. This race will be one of the most closely watched legislative contests this year.

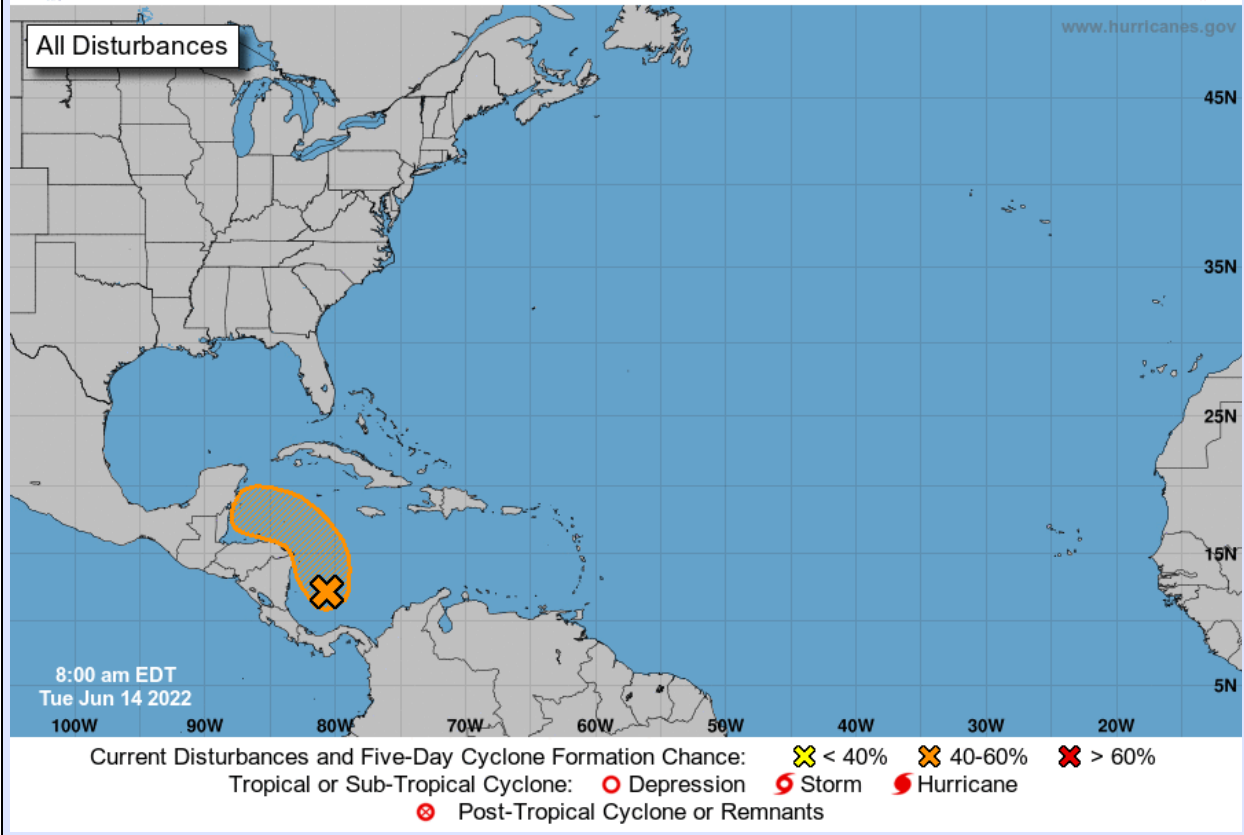
Five Day Tropical Outlook
