FDOT Pauses Northern Turnpike Expansion

The Florida Department of Transportation announced last week that is was going to pause the Northern Turnpike Extension Project. The pause is directly related to the opposition of citizens from the Citrus, Levy, Marion and Sumter county, and the adoption of 'No Build' resolutions by the Levy Board of County Commission, Citrus Board of County Commission, Dunnellon City Council, Inverness City Council, Inglis Town Commission, Yankeetown Council, and Bronson Town Council.

15 Days Until the Florida Primary

Early voting for the Aug. 23 primary is starting today in more than 20 counties, including Duval, Miami-Dade, Orange, and Palm Beach. While a handful of counties will start early voting later this week, most counties will start this Saturday. Many of the State and Local Races will be settled on August 23.

U.S. Senate passes climate, tax and health care bill – House to consider bill this week!

U.S. Senate passed the health care, climate and tax bill Sunday afternoon. The bill passed 51-50. The legislation includes a new minimum tax on large corporations, provisions to lower prescription drug prices and more than \$300 billion to address climate change and promote clean energy. It now heads to the House, which plans to take it up Friday.
