Joint Legislative Budget Commission to consider approving \$175,000,000 for 238 Proposals

The Joint Legislative Budget Commission, which is made up of House and Senate members, will meet Friday to consider a list of “Local Support Grant” proposals. Lawmakers submitted 971 requests for the grants this summer. The Friday meeting also includes an update on the state’s long-range fiscal outlook from state economists, considering \$1.5 million to hire a consultant to look at options for financial ratings for property insurers and approving money to activate Florida National Guard members to help at short-staffed state prisons. The meeting will more than likely be covered on The Florida Channel.

Poll Shows Races for Governor and U.S. Senate are close

According to a new poll commissioned by AARP Florida, the races for Governor and U.S. Senate are close. According to the poll, DeSantis leads Democratic nominee Crist by three points, 50%-47%, while U.S. Sen. **Marco Rubio** holds just a two-point edge over U.S. Rep. **Val Demings**. In both races, the gap falls within the poll’s margin of error. The poll received responses from 1,626 likely General Election voters, and Republicans made up 40% of the sample compared to a 37% share for Democrats.

New Resources to help households enroll in the Affordable Connectivity Program.

The FCC has announced new programs to narrow the digital divide in many communities. The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP), created by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, presents an opportunity by providing qualified households with a \$30 monthly discount on broadband service.

- The first is the [Affordable Connectivity Outreach Grant Program](#), which will offer \$100 million in competitive grant funding to entities working to inform eligible households about ACP and assist them with the enrollment process.
- The second is the “[Your Home, Your Internet](#)” pilot program, a \$10 million pilot intended to help raise awareness about ACP among households receiving federal housing benefits.

An estimated 48 million households nationwide are eligible to receive the discounted broadband service.

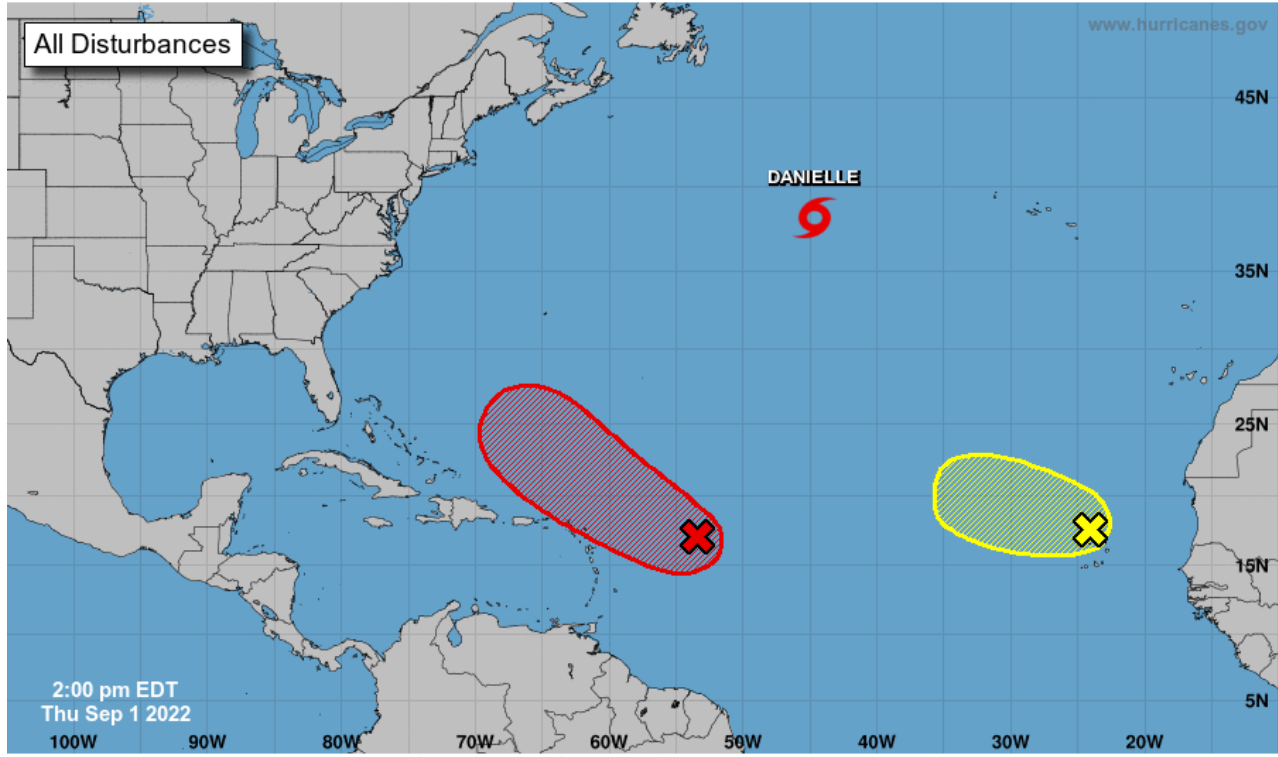
