<u>The Quick</u>

Special Legislative Session

Although no date has been set yet, the Governor announced that he will call the House and Senate into a Special Session sometime before the end of the year to deal with Hurricane Ian impacts and, potentially property tax reform. It is probable that the session will be in the first weeks of December.

Local Governments Analyzing Impact of Executive Order Suspending Ad Valorem Payment

Executive Order #2022-242 suspends property tax deadlines re: Hurricane Ian

This past Thursday Governor Ron DeSantis signed Executive Order 22-242 suspending deadlines for payment of property taxes in the 26 counties impacted by Hurricane Ian. The EO extends to real property including personal homes and commercial properties that were destroyed or otherwise rendered uninhabitable. In response, counties have been asked to determine the potential impact of delaying the collection of tax payments. County Administrators, Managers, Coordinators have been requested by FAC to assess the effects on each County to ensure each county has an idea of potential impacts. Please realize this order impacts property destroyed/ uninhabitable only and not the land the property sits upon.

Challenge to Law Restricting Instruction on Gender/Sexual Orientation Rejected by Court

A federal judge refused to block school districts from carrying out a new state law that restricts instruction on gender identity and sexual orientation in classrooms, rejecting arguments by parents, students and a nonprofit organization. The ruling was the second time in less than a month that a federal judge has turned down a challenge to the law. The court issued a 28-page decision that denied a request for a preliminary injunction against the law. The law prevents instruction on gender identity and sexual orientation in kindergarten through third grade and requires that such instruction be "age-appropriate ... in accordance with state academic standards" in higher grades.

Early voting in the Nov. 8 general election will begin Monday in Alachua, Bay, Bradford, Brevard, Broward, Calhoun, Charlotte, DeSoto, Duval, Escambia, Flagler, Franklin, Gadsden, Hendry, Hillsborough, Indian River, Jefferson, Lake, Lee, Leon, Levy, Liberty, Manatee, Miami-Dade, Monroe, Okaloosa, Orange, Osceola, Palm Beach, Pinellas, Polk, Putnam, Santa Rosa, Sarasota, Seminole, St. Lucie and Taylor counties. All counties are required to offer early voting from Oct. 29 to Nov. 5 but have the option to begin as soon as Monday.



- TRANSGENDER TREATMENTS: A joint committee of the Florida Board of Medicine and the Florida Board of Osteopathic Medicine will discuss a draft rule that could restrict doctors from providing treatments to transgender people under age 18. The meeting will come after the Florida Department of Health in July filed a petition seeking a rule-making process on the contentious issue of treatment for gender dysphoria. The petition proposed what is known as a "standard of care" that would prohibit patients under age 18 from receiving sex-reassignment surgery and puberty-blocking, hormone and hormone "antagonist" treatments. It also would require that older patients sign a consent form and then wait 24 hours before starting such treatments.
