# DEO Office of Broadband Conducts Webinar on New Broadband Program

The DEO Office of Broadband held the first of two technical assistance webinars this morning. There were over 150 participants that submitted dozens of questions attempting to clarify how the new Opportunity Broadband grant application process will work. The webinar was recorded and will be posted on the DEO Office of Broadband Webpage. It is clear from the questions and answers that coordination between Local Technology Planning Teams and Providers is critical in the development of applications for funding. It is recommended that LTPT's engage local ISP's in their conversation to determine if and/or what the ISP has for providing broadband services to existing unserved and underserved areas. The Small County Coalition will continue to work with the Florida Association of Counties' ACCESS 67 Initiative to foster clear understanding and collaboration with local stakeholders and current/potential providers that are considering seeking funding within the State's program.


