State Broadband Program

<u>Heads Up – DEO has Officially Begun the Rule-Making Process for the Broadband Grant Program</u>

There are significant concerns with the proposed rules!

The Florida Office of Broadband has released its <u>Notice of Proposed Rule (NPR)</u> establishing the rules and criteria for the Broadband Opportunity Program (BOP). The BOP <u>Grant Application</u> and <u>Scoring & Evaluation Criteria</u> are now available on DEO's website.

Revised Rules for State Grant Program Do Not Accommodate Critical Concerns

- The proposed rules provide funding on a reimbursement basis Rural Areas Need Advance funding.
- The proposed rules do not include a waiver of match for fiscally constrained counties Many counties cannot afford a 50% match. Waiver of match is authorized in statutes.
- Rural Areas need to be given special consideration to ensure unserved areas are targeted.
- Application Requirements are arduous and embody unnecessary requirements
- The grant program does not include any provision of upfront assistance for Local Technology Planning Team functions.

If additional changes are not made, the rules impose obstacles that many rural areas will not be able to address, and, in effect, the proposed rules will undermine the intent of the program it is created to serve.

Changes were made from the initial draft rules, DEO has modified the rules to include a requirement that engages LTPT's in project development -

• Local Support/LTPT language included in the rule:(4) To be considered for grant funding under the Program, Applicants must show community support from the local community within and near the project area and/or engagement with the county's Local Technology Planning Team when submitting a Broadband Opportunity Program Grant Application, which is incorporated by reference in Rule 73C-50.001, F.A.C., and available on the Office's website, www.floridajobs.org/broadband, to the Office within the noticed application window.

Major Concerns still exist with the proposed rules –

- The grant requirements still provide grant funding on a reimbursement basis. Reimbursements create an additional financial burden on all counties especially fiscally constrained counties. This method of funding will deter government applicants from applying for generational investments. There are 29 fiscally constrained counties in the state that are likely "underserved" or "unserved" a reimbursement policy will effectively undermine participation. Reimbursements fail to align with local government budgeting processes. Counties may be unable to offset initial expenses due to budget constraints/fiscal year/budget timeline.
- Waiver of Match the rules still require a 50% match for grant funds. The statutes provide
 agencies with authority to waive match in grant programs and to provide special consideration in
 the grant review process. The proposed rules are silent on these issues and beg the question as to
 whether the DEO will implement these statutory provisions outside the existing rules. See

- Technical Assistance Funding for LTPT Activities Counties need additional technical assistance funding to support LTPT assessments. The Small County Coalition has consistently indicated that the success of the LTPT's are foundational to the success of the overall provision and expansion of broadband across the state. These entities are overseeing planning, mapping, community involvement, collaboration with Internet Service Providers and much more. It is again, requested that the DEO OofB establish as part of the Broadband Opportunity Grant Program a Technical Assistance category that would provide initial funding to assist the LTPT's in fulfilling their responsibilities.


