Board of Ed to Take Up New School Rules

The state <u>Board of Education is scheduled today</u> to take up several of the changes to what and how schools can teach. Among the changes up for discussion are those requiring notice if students use bathrooms or locker rooms different from their at-birth gender, allowing parents to review certain education records, and prohibiting the teaching of certain ideas sometimes known as Critical Race Theory, including the idea that people bear responsibility for the actions of their race as a whole. Also up for consideration is <u>a proposed rule that would set out disciplinary action</u> for teachers who teach about sexual orientation or gender identity to students below grade 3. A proposed rule would punish that infraction by revoking a teacher's license. <u>BOE Agenda</u>

The Office of Broadband is hosting a Statewide Technical Assistance Webinar on October 20, 2022. 30 Day Application Period to Open November 2nd

The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) is preparing to open the application window for the Broadband Opportunity Program, a \$400 million grant program created to expand broadband Internet service in unserved areas of the state. On September 28, 2022, DEO's Office of Broadband submitted its notice of proposed rulemaking to the Florida Administrative Register and commenced the 30-day online posting of application and scoring materials required in Section 288.9962, F.S., on www.FloridaJobs.org/Broadband.

Beginning on November 2, 2022, the 30-day application window for the Broadband Opportunity Program will open. The last day to submit a grant application will be at 5:00 PM Eastern Standard Time (EST) on December 2, 2022.

DEO's Office of Broadband will host a second technical assistance webinar for the Broadband Opportunity Program ahead of the application window opening on November 2nd:


