

#### **Tropical Storm Nicole:**

- At 4:00 AM EST Wednesday, the center of Tropical Storm Nicole was located approximately 270 miles east of Boynton Beach, Florida, and moving west-southwest near 13 mph.
- A turn toward the west is expected today, approaching the East Coast of Florida tonight. The center of Nicole is then forecast to turn toward the northwest on Thursday as the system moves across Central and North Florida into Thursday night.
- Maximum sustained winds have increased to 70 mph, and Nicole is forecast to be a hurricane later today while it is moving near the northwestern Bahamas and approaching the East Coast of Florida. Nicole is predicted to be a hurricane upon landfall in Florida.
- Gradual weakening is expected after landfall, but Nicole is expected to remain a large tropical storm during its trek across Florida.

#### Florida Outlook:

- Nicole poses a risk for significant coastal flooding, strong winds, storm surge, heavy rain and isolated tornadoes along much of the Florida East Coast.
- Due to the large wind field of Nicole, strong wind gusts may be felt across the entire Florida Peninsula and Florida Big Bend on Wednesday and Thursday.
- A Hurricane Warning has been issued for 6 Florida East Coast counties, with Tropical Storm Watches and Warnings in effect for 48 additional counties across the Peninsula and Big Bend.
- Nicole is a large tropical storm, with tropical storm-force winds extending outward up to 460 miles from the center (especially to the north).

- Nicole's broad cloud and wind field is starting to move onshore the Florida Peninsula this morning, and deteriorating conditions will continue to overspread from east to west today. Tropical storm conditions could arrive in the Florida Big Bend as early as tonight.
- Elevated tides, ocean swells, and strong winds will push water upstream through the St. Johns, leading to coastal flooding along the river.
- Deteriorating beach conditions can be expected across the East Coast as a result of elevated tides and wave heights of 12-22'.
- A Storm Surge Warning is in effect along the entire Florida East Coast north of North Palm Beach, as well as from the mouth of the St. Johns River to Georgetown, Florida. Storm surge values of 3-5' are forecast, with locally surge values of 6' possible. A Storm Surge Watch is in effect south of North Palm Beach to Hallandale Beach, Florida and along the Florida Nature Coast between the Anclote River and mouth of the Ochlockonee River where surge heights could reach 2-4'.
- Rainfall amounts of 2-6" are possible across much of the Florida Peninsula, leading to a slight risk of flash flooding and rises on local rivers. A Flood Watch is in effect for 27 Peninsula Counties.
- Isolated tornadoes are possible in the outer bands of Nicole and could affect eastern portions of the Florida Peninsula on today and Thursday. The Storm Prediction Center has upgraded portions of the East Coast to a Slight Risk (level 2 of 5) through Friday morning.
