Florida Gains Top Spot for Fastest Growing State in the U.S.

Florida is the fastest growing state in the U.S., <u>according to a Census report released Thursday</u>, reclaiming the top spot for the first time in more than 60 years. The state saw a 1.9 percent population increase from 2021 to 2022, surpassing population growth in any other state for the first time since 1957. Florida's population has grown every year since 1946— even when U.S. population growth slowed overall.
