Governor's Inauguration Will be Tuesday at the Capitol

Governor DeSantis' 2nd term will take center stage this week in Tallahassee with Inauguration activities scheduled for Tuesday. The swearing-in ceremony will be held on the Old Capitol steps beginning at 11:00am on Tuesday – it is scheduled to run until about 12:45pm. DeSantis has become the dominant figure in Florida politics since becoming governor and is widely viewed as a potential Republican presidential candidate in 2024. He won reelection by nearly 20 percentage points. The inauguration theme: "The Free State of Florida." A number of local elected officials from Florida's small counties will be in attendance for the swearing in ceremony and the Inaugural Ball – scheduled for Tuesday evening. <u>Legislature to Convene Committees – Wednesday and Thursday</u> <u>The Florida House and</u> November Revenue Collections Exceed Projections by \$447.2 million

Overall Revenue Collections have exceed projections by \$1,098.5 for the 2022-23 Fiscal Year

General Revenue collections for November 2022 showed a gain of \$447.2 million (14.1 percent) over the forecast assumptions made by the General Revenue Estimating Conference (GR REC) in August 2022. November collections reflect activity that largely occurred in October. The Office of Economic and Demographic Research's preliminary analysis indicates recovery and rebuilding efforts associated with Hurricane Ian added as much as \$119.1 million to final liability for the month, with over one-half of the total related to the purchase of autos. Translated to Sales Tax GR, this equates to \$104.8 million. EDR's data also showed that prices for food at home increased by 12.0 percent in November, slightly down from the 12.4 percent in October.

Workers' Comp Rates Decrease – Effective Jan. 1

An average 8.4 percent decrease in workers' compensation insurance rates will take Sunday – January 1.

Jacob Oliva Nominated to become Arkansas' Education Secretary

Jacob Oliva, a senior chancellor at the Florida Department of Education, is being nominated by Arkansas Governor-Elect Sarah Huckabee Sanders to become the Arkansas education secretary. Oliva, a former Flagler County superintendent of schools, has worked at the Florida Department of Education since 2017 and heads the Division of Public Schools.

Former Rep. Charlie Stone files to run for Marion County's House Seat 24

The race to replace former state Rep. Joe Harding, R-Ocala, in a special election in Marion County's House District 24 is getting crowded. Five candidates (all R's) have opened campaign accounts to run for the seat. Charlie Stone, served in the House from 2012 to 2020, opened an account last week. Stone is also a former Marion County Commissioner . No Democratic candidates had opened accounts as of Friday morning, according to the Division of Elections website. The formal qualifying period for the race will be held Jan. 9 and Jan. 10. A primary election will be held March 7, with a general election scheduled for May 16 if it is needed. Harding resigned from the House after being indicted on federal charges of wire fraud, money laundering and making false statements.

Federal Court Upholds School Board Policy on Use of Bathroom

After a five-year legal battle, a federal appeals court upheld a St. Johns County School Board policy that prevented a transgender male student from using boys' bathrooms at a high school. The 11th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, in a 7-4 decision, said the policy did not violate the constitutional equal-protection rights of Drew Adams, who was required to use a gender-neutral, single-stall bathroom or girls' bathrooms while a student at Nease High School. The court's majority also said the policy did not violate Title IX, a federal law that prevents discrimination based on sex in education programs.
