3,100 Local Appropriation Projects Submitted Seeking over \$6 Billion

Legislators have submitted over 3,100 budget requests seeking over \$6 billion in funding for local projects and programs. Many of the applications overlap between the House and Senate.

- House members have submitted 2,165 budget requests seeking \$4.65 billion.

Budget requests will be considered as the House and Senate craft the budget for the 2023-2024 fiscal year that is likely to exceed \$110 billion.

Governor will get the final say - - Last year, the budget passed by the House and Senate funded 1,221 local projects within the budget - The Governor vetoed - 360 projects linked to proposals by senators and 325 linked to House members.

Bloom ruled that two parts of the law violated constitutional equal-protection rights, issuing a permanent injunction against them. The law was a priority of Gov.
