IMPORTANT CORRECTION -

Sheriff Deputy Salary Increases <mark>are recommended</mark> in the Governors Budget

The funding for the increase for Sheriff Deputies was included in the Governors Budget Proposal. It is in line item 1275 in the Governor's Budget. An earlier Briefing indicated that it was not included – that was wrong. The funding was included in a line item that did not identify the specific recipients or purpose.

Significant Actions

Sovereign Immunity

Representatives of School Districts, Counties and Municipalities joined in a chorus of testimony opposing the proposed changes to Sovereign Immunity caps. The House Civil Justice Subcommittee amended HB 401 increasing Sovereign Immunity Caps from \$200,000 to \$2.5 million per individual and from \$300,000 to \$5 million per incident. Although the bill passed concerns were expressed by several Republican committee members calling for the bill to be changed as it proceeds through the process.

- Presentation of the *Governor's Proposed Budget*
- Education Bills passing Senate Education Committee
 - O SB 52 (ED) by Senator Burgess—Required Instruction in Public Schools
 - o SB 178 (ED) by Senator Berman—Upgrades to Education Facilities as Emergency Shelters
 - o SB 190 (ED) by Senator Grall—Interscholastic Extracurricular Activities
 - SB 212 (ED) by Senator Collins—*Emergency Response Mapping Data*
- Presentation on Florida Springs
- Special Session Bills Emergency Response; Statewide Prosecutors; and, Transporting Unauthorized Aliens all proceeded to move through the Special Session.
- HB453 A bill proposing Concealed Carry without a License passed House committee.
- In anticipation of an expanded choice program, the House Choice and Innovation Committee received a comprehensive overview of existing *K-12 Choice Programs*

- The House committee on education also scheduled a discussion of Graduation Options and Graduation Rates
- Two bills passed in Senate Community Affairs and will get a great deal of attention:
 - SB 102 Affordable Housing includes a number of changes and additional funding to stimulate and fast-track affordable housing development.
 - O SB 170 *Local Ordinances* is a bill that requires impact statements and provides for individual and businesses to challenge ordinances that they feel impacts their profits.
- Reconstituting 3 Special Districts including the Eastpoint Water and Sewer District, Franklin county
- Presentation on the **REACH Act** to House Post-Secondary Committee
- Discussion of School Start Times in House Choice & Innovation Subcommittee
- HB 401 **Sovereign Immunity** was heard in House Civil Justice Subcommittee increasing SI caps from \$200,000 to \$2.5 million per person and from \$300,000 to \$5,000,000 million per incident.
