Senate and House Budget Proposals

House and Senate Legislative Budget Proposals will be adopted next week!

Senate Procedures for Consideration of the Senate's Proposed GAA for 23-24

- The Senate's Consolidated Proposed Budget PCBs will be available on Thursday, March 23.
- The Appropriations Committee will meet <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>March 28</u> to consider the Proposed GAA, Implementing and Companion PCBs.
- The Amendment Deadline for Tuesday's Appropriations meeting will be 1pm Friday, March 24. The Deadline for adhering amendments will be 1pm Monday, March 27.

House Procedures for Consideration of the House's Proposed Appropriations Act

- No later than Friday, March 24: House will publish the Proposed GAA, Implementing Bill and Conforming Bills.
- Tuesday, March 28: House Appropriations Committee will meet to hear the Budget PCBs.
- Budget PCB Amendments due by 4:30 p.m. Monday, March 27
- Wednesday, March 29: House will publish the GAA, Implementing Bill and Conforming Bills to be considered on the House Floor the following week.
- Floor Amendment deadline is 9 a.m. the business day before the GAA is considered on Special Order.
