Small County Coalition Members Push for Road Funds

SCRAP and SCOP are priority programs for Florida's small counties. Additional Funding is requested to match current year funding levels.

Without Additional Non-Recurring Funding Added the SCRAP and SCOP programs will be funded at \$50 million Below current year levels.

339.2816 - Small County Road Assistance Program. - The purpose of this program is to assist small county governments that have a population of 75,000 or less in resurfacing or reconstructing county roads.

339.2818 - Small County Outreach Program. - The purpose of this program is to assist small county governments that have a population of 200,000 or less in repairing or rehabilitating county bridges, paving unpaved roads, addressing road-related drainage improvements, resurfacing or reconstructing county roads, or constructing capacity or safety improvements to county roads.

Please contact your House and Senate members requesting additional funding for SCOP and SCRAP.

Current Funding Status -

- In 22-23, SCRAP was funded at \$27,673,968 from the Transportation Trust fund. SCOP was funded at \$84,985,746 from the same source. In addition, in the 22-23 GAA, the Legislature allocated an additional \$50 million in non-recurring funding in a back of the bill provision.
- Both the House and Senate recommend funding for SCRAP and SCOP at the following amounts SCRAP at \$28,355,898 and SCOP at \$94,002,484. Neither the House nor the Senate have allocated any additional non-recurring funding to boost the SCRAP and SCOP appropriation. Without Additional Non-Recurring Funding Added the SCRAP and SCOP programs will be funded at \$50 million Below current year levels.

Repeal of Enterprise Florida moves forward in the House

The House Ways and Means Committee is scheduled to take up HB 5 - Economic Programs – 2023 - Economic Programs when it meets in the morning. The bill Repeals Enterprise Florida provisions and transfers all duties, records, pending issues, rules, & unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, & other public funds relating to programs in Enterprise Florida, Inc., to DEO by type two transfer; authorizes Florida Sports Foundation to enter into an agreement with DEO for certain purposes & use certain funds. Effective Date: July 1, 2023

School Start Time Bill HB 733 – Goes to House Floor

The House is scheduled to go into session Thursday afternoon. One of the bills on the agenda is HB 733 prohibiting High School start time earlier than 8:30am and Middle School Start times earlier than 8:00am. The prohibition goes into effect on July 1 of 2026. The Small School District Council Consortium has spoken against the proposal in both House and Senate committees. If you have concerns about this required you should express them to you House and Senate members.
