DACS Accepting Applications for Agriculture Education and Promotion Facilities for 2024

The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is accepting applications for state funding of grants in aid for construction and/or renovation of agriculture education and promotion facilities, as outlined in Florida Statute Section 288.1175 and Florida Administrative Code Chapter 5H-25. Applicants must meet all requirements of this statute and rule in order to be considered eligible for funding.

Lt. Gov. Nunez Ready to Lead – If!

Florida Lt. Governor Jeanette Nunez confirmed in an interview yesterday that she looks forward to serving in "whatever capacity" if Governor Ron DeSantis is elected to a higher office. If DeSantis runs for President and wins in 2024, the Governorship would transfer to Nunez upon DeSantis's swearing in and she would serve out the last two years of his term, according to the Florida constitution.

"First of all the Governor has not made any announcements so we will wait and see what happens," Nunez stated during a press conference at the Governor's annual Hurricane Conference at the Palm Beach Convention Center. "He picked me as his Lieutenant Governor. I look forward to serving the people in whatever capacity that might be."

FWC Commission Goes Inside the Agency to Select New Executive Director Col. Roger Young picked to succeed Eric Sutton

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission promoted Col. Roger Young to become the agency's executive director. Young, has worked 27 years for the state, has overseen the commission's Division of Law Enforcement since June 2021. Young succeeds Eric Sutton who stepped down in December after being executive director for five years. Young, who grew up in South Florida and earned a degree from Florida State University in 1993, joined the Florida Marine Patrol as an officer in Taylor County before transferring to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission after it was created in 1999.
