## The Quick

#### USDA Forecast at 90 year low for Citrus Harvest

The U.S. Department of Agriculture on Friday issued a forecast that said Florida growers this season are on pace to fill 15.65 million boxes of oranges, which would be the lowest total since the 1934-1935 season. The new forecast also was down from an April projection of 16.1 million boxes. Florida growers produced 41.2 million boxes of oranges during the 2021-2022 session. Additional numbers will be released in June and July. In addition to sustaining heavy damage in last fall's Hurricane Ian, the industry has battled for two decades against deadly citrus greening disease and development pressures. The federal forecast gave grapefruit production a slight boost, putting it at an estimated 1.8 million boxes this season. That was up from 1.6 million boxes in a March forecast and 1.7 million boxes in an April forecast.

# Teacher of the Year Finalists Announced 4 of the 5 are Small District Teachers

This week the Florida Department of Education announced the five 2024 Teacher of the Year state finalists. The finalists were chosen from 74 district teachers of the year. Four of the five finalists are from small school districts.

• Adrianna Swearingen, Bay County – is a media specialist at Northside Elementary School in Bay County.

- **Kimberly Crowder, Hamilton County is** a reading intervention teacher at Hamilton County Elementary School in Hamilton County.
- **Sarah Idsardi, Hardee County is** a fourth-grade teacher at North Wauchula Elementary School in Hardee County.
- **Jennie Goffe, Hendry County** is an agricultural teacher at Clewiston High School in Hendry County for the past ten years.
- **Kayla Jackson, Highlands County teaches at** Memorial Elementary School in Highlands County where she serves as a fifth-grade math and science teacher.

The 2024 Florida Teacher of the Year winner will be announced on July 20, 2023, in Orlando. The winner will serve for one year as the Christa McAuliffe Ambassador for Education.

# **DeSantis Signs School Start Time Bill**

Gov. DeSantis signed HB 733 that mandates starts times for Middle and High Schools. The legislation will prevent middle schools from beginning the "instructional day" earlier than 8 a.m., while high schools will be barred from starting the school day before 8:30 a.m. The start times will be required to take effect by July 2026. 67 percent of Florida's public high schools start school before 8:00am. The bill was a priority of House Speaker Paul Renner. The bill was opposed by the Small School District Council Consortium because of concerns regarding the safety of young students having to start earlier, impact of work schedules and before and after school supervision, impact on after school academic and athletic events, and cost of running additional bus routes. Although many districts already comply with the required times – many small counties do not, in addition the later times have been considered and rejected by Orange and Miami-Dade. The legislature allocated \$5,000,000 to provide grants to assist with implementation.
