The Annual Summer Small District Breakfast was held this past Thursday morning. The event is a joint meeting of the FSBA Small District Council and the Small School District Council Consortium. During the Meeting elections were held for leaders of the FSBA Small District Council and SSDCC Officers for FY23-24.

- Leadership Changes within the FSBA Small District Council Shirley Owens (Holmes) and Christie McElroy (Gilchrist) completed their terms and did not seek re-election.
- The new officers elected are-

- Elections also were held for the Small School District Council Consortium. Long-time Chair Supt. Sherrie Raulerson (Baker) stepped down and Supt. Bobby Pearce (Wakulla) was elected Chair. Supt Chris Cowart (Levy) was elected Vice-Chair, and, Supt. Rick Surrency (Putnam) was elected to a post on the SSDCC Executive Committee.
- During the meeting Chris Doolin and Bob Jones were affirmed as the Governmental Consultants to the SSDCC and participation fees were approved at the current level.

#### <u>County Medicaid Cost Share For FY 23-24 Reduced from original Estimate</u> Previous Calculation of 23-24 county contribution modified

During the Budget Conference Process, section 27 of SB 2502 was added to the appropriations bill. The section clarified that in determining the growth in the county contribution to Medicaid, amounts contributed under the Directed Payment Program were not to be included in the calculation. This change reduced the growth amount from 15.5% to 9.2%, a statewide savings of \$17.5 Million. The revised Social Service Estimating Conference Workpapers are available here. Attached is a spreadsheet that compares the county level required contributions prior to the law change with the required contributions after the law change and shows the savings to each county due to the legislation.



Note - SB 2502 has not yet been presented to the Governor nor signed into law.


