Governor Announces Funding for 63 Broadband Projects

Governor Ron DeSantis awarded more than \$247 million through the Broadband Infrastructure Program, connecting more than 59,000 unserved and underserved businesses, homes, farms and anchor institutions like hospitals and libraries to high-speed Internet. Infrastructure deployment through 63 strategic projects in 43 Florida counties ensures that Florida residents have reliable and efficient access to workforce, education and health monitoring opportunities for generations to come.

These awards are in addition to <u>more than \$226 million in Broadband Opportunity Grant Funding already</u> awarded to 53 counties awards to expand broadband Internet access to unserved areas across the state, connecting more than 250,000 homes and businesses. Additional funding will become available this year through <u>new and existing programs</u>.

SDA To Release 2022-23 Final Monthly Citrus Report

Citrus-greening disease, development pressures, and Hurricanes all hit citrus growers in 2023-23. This coming Wednesday, the U.S. Department of Agriculture will give a final tally of how bad the industry go hit. The department will issue a final monthly report about Florida's citrus production during the 2022-2023 season. The report is likely to show the lowest production in nearly a century, based on numbers released in June.

The June report estimated Florida would produce 15.75 million boxes of oranges this season. That would be down from 41.2 million boxes during the 2021-2022 season — a total that itself was the lowest production in decades.

When grapefruit and specialty crops were added, the June report estimated Florida would produce slightly more than 18 million boxes during this season. That would be the lowest total since the 1927-1928 season.

DeSantis Appoints Three to Parkland Commission

Gov. <u>Ron DeSantis</u> appointed three new members to the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Commission. The Commission was created in the wake of the state's worst school shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in 2018 which left 17 dead and 17 others at the school injured. The Legislature charged it with analyzing school safety data and making recommendations for system improvements. The <u>Commission</u> is authorized through July 1, 2025. New members appointed Friday were:

- Pamela Davis, chief of the Punta Gorda Police Department since 2017.

— Daniel Foganholi, DeSantis' appointee to the <u>Broward County School Board</u>, representing District One.

- John Newman, the chief of Security and Emergency Management for Hillsborough County.


