Purchasing Guide outlines Eligible Uses of School Voucher Funds

242,929 students are enrolled in the voucher program

The Florida Policy Institute has requested information about school vouchers from Florida Education Commissioner Manny Diaz. The universal school voucher program took effect in Florida on July 1.

FPI's request for more information on the expansion of the voucher program came days after Florida Tax Credit Scholarship/Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options Purchasing Guide 2023-24 was published by Step Up For Children revealing that vouchers in the state could be used to pay for TVs, theme park tickets and kayaks. The Florida Policy Institute wants to see a breakdown of demographics for these students, such as race and ethnicity.

In addition to the purchasing guide, information released by Step Up for Children indicates that 122,895 students used these scholarships for the first time, 69% were already attending private schools. Forty-four percent come from households that make \$120,000 a year or more for a family of four. Here's some data Step Up provided on Florida's school voucher program:

- 242,929 students are enrolled in the voucher program
- 122,895 are new to the program
- 84,505 of these new recipients (69%) were already in private school, 16,096 (13%) came from public schools, and 22,294 are entering kindergartners

- 53,828 (44%) of new students are from families that make over \$120,000 for a household of four or did not submit income. Thirty percent are from families that make \$55,000 for a household of four
- Of the 242,929 total students enrolled, 44% are from families that make \$55,000 for a household of four, 29% are from families that make \$55,000 to \$120,000 for a household of four

Florida DOT Finishes First Pass at cleaning up Idalia Debris

FDOT has completed the first pass of debris pickup on all state roads in every county within the impacted parts of the state. To date, FDOT crews have picked up over 100,000 cubic yards of debris within two weeks of Hurricane Idalia making landfall. FDOT provided targeted support to the seven fiscally constrained counties who requested assistance, including with debris pickup. Small County Commissioners Participate in discussion of State Legislative Proposals


Commissioners from Small Counties participated this week in the Legislative Policy 'Conference held by the Florida Association of Counties. The Legislative Policy Conference was held to consider proposals for consideration for the 2024 Legislative Session. Policies ranged from proposals impacting economic development, local revenues, protecting local control, water and the environment. Commissioner involved in policy discussions were Small County Officers Russell Melendy, Tray Hawkins, Chris Dougherty and Coalition Executive Committee members – Susan Adams, Ramon Iglesias, Larry Harvey, John Meeks, Terry Burroughs, and Michele Lincoln. Other small county commissioners participated as well. The Small County Coalition is in the process of finalizing a proposed set of Legislative Priorities for consideration by Coalition members.

Rep. Perez to be designated 2025-26 House Speaker

Rep. Daniel Perez, R-Miami, is slated during a Monday ceremony to be formally designated as the next House speaker, one of the most-powerful positions in the state. Perez will become speaker after the November 2024 elections and will lead the House during the 2025 and 2026 sessions. Perez, an attorney, was elected to the House in a 2017 special election and serves as chairman of the Rules Committee. He will succeed Speaker Paul Renner, R-Palm Coast.
