Legislative Local Budget Requests Stack Up for Consideration

Hundreds of projects seeking billions of dollars have been submitted for consideration in preparation for the start of the 2024 legislative session in January.

- House members had filed just under 1,500 separate proposals that would require \$3.1 billion to fund.
- Senators had submitted 332 projects that call for about \$675 million in funding.

Proposals will be considered as the legislature draft a budget for the 2024-2025 year during the upcoming session. Many of the requests will not get funded or will not receive the full amounts sought by lawmakers.
