House Moves Homestead Exemption Expansion

The House Ways & Means Committee met yesterday and approved two constitutional proposals that, if adopted, will provide additional property tax reduction by kexpanding the current Homestead Exemptions.

- Proposal 1 <u>WMC1.pdf Bill Text</u> if adopted would be an increase increase the current allowable homestead by an additional \$25,000 which will provide an estimated \$1 1.1 billion of ad valorem reduction of property owners that file homestead exemption on their property.
- Proposal 2 <u>WMC2.pdf Bill Text</u> will add an annual CPI adjustment to existing homestead exemption values. The effect would be effectively eliminate growth in local ad valorem revenues available for local government use. The estimated negative impact will be \$23 million to over \$100 million.
- Proposal 3 is an implementing statute. <u>WMC3.pdf Bill Text</u> The is a proposed statute that will implement WMC 1 and/or 2 if it goes into effect.
