Tidbits From Tallahassee

Budget Conference is over! Waiting to have it put on the desk! Will be sometime later today!

The Budget Negotiations are complete – a Conference Report will be on the desks later today! At that point the 72 hr. waiting period will begin before the budget can be approved by the House and Senate - will be sometime on Friday. In the meantime – the Budget Chairs will do presentations so that they won't have to take up the time on Friday. Here's a look at the last "Special Sprinkle" list of projects being inserted into the budget.

Senate Supplemental Funding Initiatives (453 KB) House Supplemental Funding Initiatives (168 KB)

Tax Package Still Being Finalized

The House has passed its version of the tax package – HB 7073 and has sent it to the Senate. It is anticipated that the Senate will take up the House bill and do a "Strike All" which will change some of the provisions of the House version. We are working with Rep. Shoaf and Sen. Simon to ensure that a provision to offset the ad valorem rebates resulting from Idalia are taken care of in the version that passes. I was advised to be "PATIENT" – not one of my attributes.

In Other Action

- Online Protection for Minors Social Media HB 1 was vetoed and HB 3 has been amended to allow for parental consent for minors 14-15 to sign up for accounts.
- HB 141 Rural Economic Development by Abbott has passed.
- HB 705 Public Works Projects has passed it restricts bidding process. Preempts local preferences.
- HB 1567 Qualifications for Emergency Manager Directors has passed amended to eliminate Bachelor's degree
- HB 87 Taking of Bears passed Senate in messages to the House.
- HB 1473 School Safety passed Senate in messages to the House has been amended to accommodate organizations using school facilities after hours pursuant to Interlocal Agreement.
- Deregulation of Public Schools SB 7000, 7002, and 7004 are in messages to the House this legislation currently reflects the House position which is not as expansive as the original Senate Version.
- SB 644 Rural Emergency Hospitals passed the Senate in messages to the House there will be a new appropriation that will accompany this bill. I think \$10 million maybe more!
- Small County Outreach Program a provision creating a new SCOP category to address Agricultural area and farm-to-market roads is included in SB 1226. The new category will bring additional funding for this priority.
- SB 958 providing salary adjustments to the formula for School Superintendents and Tax Collectors is on Special Order in the House waiting to be agendaed for final passage.
- SB 472 Sovereign Immunity- this bill increases the SI caps from \$200K to \$300K and \$300K to \$500K. There is an amendment filed that will make additional changes that are being requested that will mitigate the potential cost increases that will materialize from other provisions.
- SB 438 Term Limits declared dead last week the bill is still available on the Senate 2nd Reading Calendar so technically it is still available for a last minute "hoopydoo"! Things happen we have several folks on alert for any last minute maneuvering.
- Increased Ad Valorem Exemptions there are two Constitutional Proposal to increase ad valorem exemptions. Neither has passed yet however, we have secured offsets for the Fiscally Constrained counties it the proposal go on the ballot and are passed.
