Term-Limits – stalled in Senate Rules – passed in final House committee Term Limits not considered on the Senate Rules Committee– Approved in the final House Committee

Commissioners Brenda Holt (Gadsden), Ralph Thomas (Wakulla), and Fred Nichols (Wakulla) spoke against the proposal in the House Committee. Additional opposition testimony was presented by the Small County Coalition, the Florida Association of Counties, the AFL-CIO, and the League of Women Voters.

- In the Senate SB 438 Proposed Term Limits up in Senate the bill was scheduled in Senate Rules Committee 9:00am-in 412 Knott Building but was temporarily passed. That means the bill was removed from consideration on the meeting agenda.
- In the House HB 57 dealing with Term Limits was scheduled for consideration in the House State Affairs committee. The bill was heard and amended to conform to the Senate version of the bill.

- Both the House and Senate bill are now identical If passed the proposals will establish 8 year term limits in counties that do not currently have term limits. In Charter Counties that currently have term limits the bill requires a referendum asking if the existing term limit should be reduced to eight years. There is no provision for counties without term limits to vote to determine whether they should be implemented.
- HB 57 will now move to the House floor. The status of SB 438 is unclear, however, there is a clear interest to pass some kind of legislation.

Sovereign Immunity – Stalled in the House

Proposed Changes

Changing S.I. caps from 200K/300K to 400K/600K Proposals allows sovereign entity to settle claim above the caps. Proposals provide for scheduled increases in the caps base on CPI.

Status of legislation

- The House version of the Sovereign Immunity changes HB 569 was scheduled to be heard in the House Judiciary committee Wednesday morning, however, the bill was not considered. Rumors are circulating the amendments added to the bill in the prior committee were causing concerns and the bill was pulled from the agenda. Is it dead? We shall see!
- The Senate version SB 472 has passed one committee and is currently in is 2nd of 3 committees.

Other Action on Priorities

Regional Rural Development Grants

- The House Proposal PCB for HB 141 passed its second of 3 committees
- The Senate Version SB 196 is scheduled for action 2-15 in Fiscal Policy its last committee before being sent to the Senate Floor.

Emergency Management Director Employment Requirements

HB 1567 and SB 1262 both moved in their second committees. HB 1567 was amended to include recommendation made by the Professional Emergency Managers which included removing a Bachelors degree as part of minimal mandatory employment criteria. The Senate sponsor indicated that he will conform the Senate Bill to the House bill. This bill seems to be moving without additional concerns.

Taking of Bears

• Both HB 87 by Shoaf and SB 642 by Simon have passed all committees and both bills are on Special Order in the House and the Senate. The bills

provide that a person can use lethal force if they reasonably believed that his or her action was necessary to avoid an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to himself or herself or to another, an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury to a pet, or substantial damage to a dwelling.

House Tax Package

- PCB WMC 24-05 The House Ways & Means Committee, Wednesday, approved a proposed \$647.3 million tax-cut package that would give breaks to businesses and shoppers. The bill (PCB WMC 24-05) is proposed for the fiscal year that will start July 1, likely will be changed as the House and Senate negotiate a final plan before the March 8 end of the legislative session.
 - o The proposal will limit new tourist-development taxes, often known as bed taxes, to six years and requires voter approval by July 1, 2029, for existing tourist-development taxes to continue.
 - The package includes a series of sales-tax "holidays," (back-to-school items, hurricane-preparedness supplies and tools).
 - The proposal allows Monroe County to use tourist-development and tourist-impact tax dollars to provide affordable housing for employees of tourism-related businesses.
 - The package projects a \$339.6 million reduction to state and local revenues achieved by , lowering a commercial-lease tax on businesses
- House Ways and Means also passed PCB WMC 24-06 a proposed constitutional amendment providing an additional \$25,000 tax exemption on Tangible personal property. The committee also passed PCB WMC 24-07 the implementing bills for the proposed amendment providing for a state appropriation to offset the impact of the increased exemption in fiscally constrained counties.

<u>HB 0001</u> Social Media Use for Minors: Requires social media platforms to prohibit minors from creating new accounts, terminate accounts & provide additional options for termination of such accounts, use reasonable age verification methods to verify ages of

account holders, & disclose specified policies & provide specified resources, measures, & disclaimers; authorizes DLA to bring actions for violations under Florida Deceptive & Unfair Trade Practices Act; provides penalties; provides for private causes of actions; provides certain social media platforms are subject to jurisdiction of state courts. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 0003 Online Access to Materials Harmful to Minors: Requires commercial entity that publishes or distributes material harmful to minors on websites & applications to perform reasonable age verification, prevent certain access, & provide for reporting unauthorized or unlawful access; prohibits retention of personal identifying information; authorizes DLA to bring action under Florida Deceptive & Unfair Trade Practices Act for violations; provides civil penalties; provides for private causes of action; provides certain commercial entities are subject to jurisdiction of state courts. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

<u>SB 0240</u>International Baccalaureate Teacher Bonuses; Revising the requirements for the calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership and certain bonuses based on International Baccalaureate examination scores of students to include students who earn equivalent scores as determined by the Department of Education, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2024

SB 0396Holocaust Remembrance Day; Requiring the Governor to annually proclaim a specified day as "Holocaust Remembrance Day"; authorizing "Holocaust Remembrance Day" to be observed in this state's public schools and be observed by public exercise as the Governor may designate, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2024

HB 0523Florida Seal of Fine Arts Program: Establishes Florida Seal of Fine Arts Program within DOE; provides purpose of program, eligibility criteria, & Commissioner of Education, DOE, & school district duties & responsibilities. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 0537Student Achievement: Removes provisions providing for award of certificate of completion to certain students; & creates Music-based Supplemental Content to Accelerate Learner Engagement & Success Pilot Program within DOE for specified purpose. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 0917 Career and Technical Education: Provides exemption for minors to work in specified conditions; requires counties & municipalities to recognize certain persons as journeymen for specified occupations if such persons meet specified criteria; provides alternative to career fairs through other career & industry networking opportunities; revises provisions relating to revisions to state academic standards, requirements for certain credits & certifications to meet specified graduation requirements; requires DOE to convene workgroup by specified date for specified purposes; provides additional exemption from completing entry-level examination for certain students; creates Career & Technical Education Task Force adjunct to DOE. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

SB 0994Student Transportation Safety; Revising the definition of the term "local hearing officer"; authorizing charter schools and private schools to install and operate school bus infraction detection systems; authorizing traffic infraction enforcement officers who meet specified requirements and school board security agencies to enforce specified violations; providing that a school safety officer who completes certain training may be authorized by a county, municipality, or school entity as a traffic infraction enforcement officer and may issue certain notices and citations, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 0996 Education; Providing that an annual application for exemption on property used to house a charter school is not required; authorizing private schools to use or purchase specified facilities; providing responsibilities for approved virtual instruction program providers, virtual charter schools, and school districts relating to statewide assessments and progress monitoring for certain students; establishing the Purple Star School District Program, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2024

<u>HB 1285</u>Education: Revises provisions relating to K-12 education, postsecondary education, & Education Practices Commission; establishes Purple Star School District Program; creates AA specialized transfer degrees; requires SBE to adopt rules for issuance of classical education teaching certificate. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

<u>HB 1349</u>Required Instruction on History of Communism: Beginning in specified school year, requires students to receive instruction on

history of Communism; provides requirements for such instruction & school districts, & DOE; & creates Communism Education Task Force. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 1353 Early Learning: Revises provisions relating to early learning coalitions & specified early learning programs. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

SB 1356School Safety; Providing that sheriffs are responsible for screening-related costs for school guardian programs; authorizing sheriffs to waive training and screening-related costs for a private school for a school guardian program; requiring the Department of Law Enforcement to maintain a list of school guardians and provide the list to any School Safety Specialist upon request; providing requirements for the list; requiring each sheriff to report on a quarterly basis to the Department of Law Enforcement the schedule for school guardian trainings, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2024

HB 1473 School Safety: Revises provisions & establishes reporting requirements for school guardian programs & school guardians; revises school safety requirements for DOE, school districts, charter schools, & school safety specialists. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

<u>SB 1652</u>District and School Advisory Councils; Renaming district advisory councils and school advisory councils as "district community advisory boards" and "community advisory boards," respectively; requiring community advisory boards to publicize specified information, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2024

HB 7051 Education: Revises provisions relating to specified education services; establishes Graduation Alternative to Traditional Education (GATE) Program for specified purpose; creates GATE Scholarship Program; & creates GATE Startup Grant Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2024
