ACTION ON THE BUDGET? NOT YET! PROBABLY AFTER MEMORIAL DAY! POSSIBLY LATER!

It is not expected that Gov. Ron DeSantis will sign the budget, and veto some pieces, this week at the very least. The governor is unlikely to act before Memorial Day and possibly not until early June. Last year, DeSantis didn't sign the budget until June 15th.

School safety dashboard helps parents and teachers address root causes of bullying, fighting

Florida updated its school safety dashboard in April 2024.

Parents can use the Safe Schools dashboard to compare safety metrics in their child's school with district and state averages as well as with other similar schools. The dashboard includes all public K-12 schools in Florida and over 50 indicators of school safety – ranging from fights and weapons to school bus crashes. Parents can also see information on school responses and resources, such as whether school staff are trained in suicide prevention and the ratio of counselors to students.

Access to this data lets parents and parent-teacher associations know what questions to ask of their teachers and school leaders to help them contribute to school improvement plans. It can also help parents better support their own children at home by talking about and addressing issues they see in the dashboard. For example, parents might talk to their kids about bullying or hazing, using the statistics in the dashboard.

With numerous measures of school safety at their fingertips, parents can look for the indicators that meet the needs of their individual child. For example, a parent with a child dealing with anxiety or depression might compare the mental health resources available at different schools.
