The State Board of Education on Wednesday will consider ratifying a change that would allow high-school athletes to be compensated for what is known by the shorthand of NIL (Name, image and likeness). The Florida High School Athletic Association last month approved the change, but the state education board also must sign off. If the proposal is approved, Florida would join about 30 states and the District of Columbia in allowing high-school athletes to receive NIL compensation.
