Florida Chamber issues mid-year progress report.

The 2024 Florida Business & Economic Mid-Year Report, just released by the Florida Chamber, delves into Florida's economic landscape, identifying five crucial factors that could shape the state's trajectory through 2030. Florida aims to rank among the top 10 global economies by 2030, emphasizing strategic growth and awareness of local and national economic impacts. The report praises strides in diversifying the economy, with significant progress in sectors like technology and manufacturing, and notes an improvement in housing supply, suggesting potential for more affordable market conditions in the future. State Rural Infrastructure Fund Is Open for Applications

The Rural Infrastructure Fund (RIF) Grant program is now open for applications. The application period will end on September 16th.

Guidelines and Information are available here.

A total of \$20 million in funding is available through RIF for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025. Funding in the amount of \$15 million is available for eligible rural communities statewide. Additionally, \$5 million is available to Panhandle Specific counties including Calhoun, Gadsden, Holmes, Jackson, Liberty, and Washington. This is a state grant offered by FloridaCommerce. This grant can be used for planning, engineering, and construction activities.

Examples of previously funded planning projects include downtown redevelopment plans, infrastructure planning & feasibility studies, stormwater management, road inventories, and other design and

engineering projects. <u>No match is required for planning projects</u>. The maximum award per planning project is \$300,000.

<u>Special Facility Construction Program Committee to Meet</u> Baker, DeSoto, Holmes, and Union school districts will be presenting

The Special Facility Construction Committee meeting to review district submissions will meet at 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, 5 September 2024 on the 17th floor of the Turlington Building in Tallahassee (325 W. Gaines Street). During the meeting, committee members will review project requests from Baker, DeSoto, Holmes, and Union school districts, evaluate the ability of each to relieve critical needs, and rank the requests in priority order. The committee is composed of two representatives from the Florida Department of Education, a representative from the Executive Office of the Governor, a representative selected by district school boards and a representative selected by district superintendents. The meeting is open to the public and expected to be finished by 5:00 p.m.

FSBA Legislative Proposal Submission

Proposals for the legislative platform are due by September 6 at 5pmET. The submission form <u>HERE</u>. All submissions are considered by the Legislative Priority Workgroup and then reviewed by the Legislative Subcommittee to develop a proposed platform. The final platform is adopted by the full FSBA Advocacy Committee which includes representatives from each member district.


