County Commissions Meet to Discuss Legislative Policies

This week the Florida Association of County held Legislative Policy Committee meetings in Pensacola. Commissioners from throughout the state met to discuss proposals relating to Water, Agriculture, Finance and Tax Proposals, Technology, and more. Term Limits for County Commissioners

A look at County Term Limits Across the State

The Florida Constitution provides that 5-7 members will be elected to four-year staggered terms. Neither the Florida Constitution nor Florida Statutes provide term limits for county commissioners. However, a charter county has the authority to set their own term limits, 11 counties in Florida imposed term limits within their county charter.

Map of Florida Counties with Self-Imposed Term Limits

In charter counties, voters have the power to set term limits. Back in 2012, the Florida Supreme Court upheld term limits for Broward County Commissioners. In William Telli v. Broward, the court which

held that a voter-approved limit for members of the county commission does not violate the Florida Constitution.

24-25 Salary Calculations for County Constitutional Officers and elected school district officials.

The Office of Economic and Demographic Research (EDR) has been unable to calculate salaries of county constitutional officers and elected school district officials for the 2024-25 fiscal year. Two components of the statutory salary formula (i.e., the Annual Factor and Cumulative Annual Factor) require annual certification by the Department of Management Services (DMS), pursuant to s. 145.19, F.S. As of this morning, EDR has not yet received this certification. Until EDR receives that certification, salaries cannot be calculated. If local officials need a salary figure for budgeting purposes, I would suggest they use the current salary figure until such time that the new FY 2024-25 salaries are published.


