

- Helene is not Cat 1 predicted to be a solid Cat 3 possibly 4
- Looks like ground zero is Carabelle in Franklin County landfall Thursday afternoon.
- Impacts will be felt all the way down to the Keys and up the Western Coastline.
- Storm is huge with statewide impact down through the peninsula.
- Rainfall will be significant and storm surge on west coast through the Big Bend will be "" DEM not mine!
- We've all been through this! Hang tight follow directions This one could be special!
