The Florida Senate has been meeting this week for orientation and outlook at the upcoming session. This morning the Senate received a very comprehensive briefing on the States Fiscal Status and the Senates plan for Local Funding Initiative Requests. Here is the video from the Senate meeting where Amy Baker, Director for the Office of Economic Demographic Research and John Shettle, Deputy Staff Director of the Senate Appropriations Committee review the Long Range Fiscal Status of the State and the Local Funding Initiative Process.
