Preparation for the 2025 Legislative Session Well Underway!

With the start of the 2025 Legislative Session over three months away, preparations are well underway. Leadership appointments have been made; Committee meetings have begun; Local delegation hearings are being scheduled; and, bills are being filed. To date, 34 bills have been filed in the Senate. In the near future – the House and Senate will open up the Legislative Budget Request Process – allowing local entities to request members of the House and Senate to submit proposals seeking funding for Local Projects. Various organizations have begun approving Legislative Priorities and state meetings of local officials will focus largely on Legislative Priorities for their members.

Political dominoes in the Sunshine State

Appointments create a scramble for Congressional and Legislative Seats

The state's resign-to-run law requires elected officials to say this week if they intend to run for the congressional seats. The qualifying period for candidates to file formal paperwork for the congressional openings begins Friday morning at 8 a.m. and runs through noon Saturday. Special primary elections for CD 1 and CD 6 will be held on Jan. 28 and special general elections will take place April 1.

Who are vacating their current positions?

- Former U.S. Rep. Matt Gaetz resignation from Congress to seek appointment as Attorney General has left Congressional District 1 an open seat.
- U.S. Rep. Mike Waltz is leaving his Northeast Florida congressional seat on Inauguration Day to serve as national security advisor.
- .S. Sen. Marco Rubio will serve as secretary of state under the new administration. Gov. Ron DeSantis will be able to appoint a successor to fill out the remaining two years of Rubio's term.

Who's in the race for the District 1 open seat?

- Chief Financial Officer Jimmy Patronis is in he intends to step down in March.
- State House Rep. Joel Rudman, R-Navarre in and submitted his resignation from the House effective Jan. 1.

Who's in the race for the Waltz open seat?

- State Sen. Randy Fine will walk away from the Senate in mid-March to run for Waltz's seat. Republicanleaning seat Congressional District 6 is made up of all or parts of Flagler, Lake, Marion, Putnam, St. Johns and Volusia Counties.
- State Rep. Debbie Mayfield, R-Melbourne, intend to seek a return to the Senate.


