Rural Renaissance Legislation Up in Senate Committee on Monday

SB 110 (CA) by Senator Simon—Rural Communities

Senate Community Affairs: Monday, March 3, 2025, 3:30—5:30 p.m., Mallory Horne Committee Room, 37 Senate Building: (MEMBERS: Senator McClain, Chair; Senator Fine, Vice Chair; Senators Jones, Leek, Osgood, Passidomo, Sharief, and Trumbull)

Senate Bill 110 – Rural Renaissance is extremely comprehensive and far-reaching. For counties and school districts – there are changes that clearly respond to issues that have been challenges in our rural areas. The bill enhances programs in a variety of important areas –

Economic Development; Road funding; Fiscally Constrained Counties; Administrative Support for rural areas; Support for counties with declining populations; Promotion of Smart Technology; Restructure of the Rural Economic Development Initiative; Updating of Broadband Speeds; Significant support for

Primary Care, Critical Health Response and Education and Rural Hospital; Increased minimum funding for Housing Programs; Strengthens Support for Rural Education Programs; and updating of the Special Facilities Construction Program.

Repeal of School Start Time Mandate Up in Senate Ed. PreK-12 Committee on Monday

SB 296 (ED) by Senator Bradley and others—Middle School and High

The Bill is a major priority of the School Districts across the State of Florida. The bill deletes the requirement of district school boards to adopt policies for middle school and high school start times; deleting a requirement that instructional days for middle schools and high schools begin no earlier than specified times.

HB 0301	Suits Against the Government by McFarland

Increases statutory limits on liability for tort claims against state & its agencies & subdivisions; authorizes subdivision to settle claim in excess of statutory limit without legislative action regardless of insurance coverage limits; prohibits insurance policy from conditioning benefits on enactment of claim bill; specifies that limitations in effect on date claim accrues apply to that claim; revises period within which certain claims must be presented; revises exceptions relating to instituting tort claims against state or agencies or subdivisions; revises period after which failure of certain entities to make final disposition of claim shall be deemed final denial of claim for certain purposes; revises statute of limitations for tort claims against state or one of its agencies or subdivisions & exceptions. Effective Date: October 1, 2025

Solar Facilities Oversight

SB 1304 Solar Facilities by Bradley

Defining the terms "agricultural land" and "decommissioned"; authorizing a county to adopt an ordinance requiring that certain solar facilities be properly decommissioned under certain circumstances; deleting a provision providing that a solar facility is a permitted use in certain land use categories and zoning districts subject to compliance certain requirements; deleting a provision exempting solar facility substations from the electric substations for which local governments may adopt and enforce certain land development regulations.

Expansion of Homestead Exemption -

HB 0357 Property Tax	Exemptions by Chamberlin
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Property Tax Exemptions: Proposes amendment to State Constitution to create \$100,000 exemption from assessed value of real property for all levies. Effective Date: Not Specified

HB 0359 Property Tax Exemptions by Chamberlin

Property Tax Exemptions: Creates certain exemption from all taxation for real property; Effective Date: on the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by HJR 357 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specified intent and purpose

SB 0852 Study on the Elimination of Property Taxes by Martin

Study on the Elimination of Property Taxes; Requiring the Office of Economic and Demographic Research to conduct a specified study; requiring the office to submit a report to the Legislature by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2025

SB 1016 Increased Homestead Property Exemptions by Ingoglia

Increased Homestead Property Exemptions; Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to increase the homestead exemption from \$25,000 to \$75,000, for all levies, with annual adjustments for inflation, deleting the exemption for school district levies, etc.

SB 1018 Homestead Exemptions by Ingoglia

Homestead Exemptions; Increasing the homestead tax exemption amount for all levies, except for assessments for special benefits; deleting homestead tax exemptions for all levies other than school district levies, etc. Effective Date: On the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by SJR 1016 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specified intent and purpose, if such amendment to the State Constitution is approved at the next general election or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose
