Governor DeSantis' Budget Released - 2025-Governors-Bill.pdf

It appears that most of the Small County priorities are included. The budget proposal will now go to the House and Senate for deliberation.

<u>School Start Time Revision</u> - bills have been filed in both the House and Senate give the decision of setting start times back to the school districts. There seems to be support at this point but there's a ways to go on this - Please as your House and Senate members to support these bills.

<u>SB 296 - School Start Times - Senator Bradley</u> <u>HB 261 - School Start Times - by Gerwig</u>

Sovereign Immunity - HB 301 - Suits Against Governments -this bill increases statutory limits on liability for tort claims from \$200,000 per individual and \$300,000 per incident to \$1,000,000 per individual and \$3,000,000 per incident. Although there is no Senate Bill at this time – it is coming. These increases will have a substantial impact on the cost of insurance and the potential for an increase in suits.

<u>Regional Education Consortia</u> were on the agenda in two Senate committees. Consortia Directors and Small District Superintendents presented the issues faced in our rural districts. Thanks to the following Superintendents for participating in panels – Darryl Taylor – Calhoun, Rick Surrency – Putnam, Mike Swindel - Hendry, Bobby Bennett – DeSoto, Buddy Brown – Holmes, Robby Edwards – Lafayette, and Mike Ripplinger – Union. It amounted to a full court press. Well done!

<u>Special Facility Construction Projects</u> – Good News here! The Governor's budget included recommended funding for all seven Special Facility Projects. The recommendation provides for an amount of 1/3 of the projected cost. We know that the cost of these projects will increase the longer that the projects wait for full funding.

<u>Arts Funding</u> – we are also pleased to report that the Governors Budget includes \$27,000,000 million for Arts and Cultural Grants. The funding for the 24-25 year was vetoed due to concern over ensuring public funds were only used for "age appropriate" projects or programs.

<u>Solar Fields</u> – there are proposals being discussed that address the pre-emption of local governments from exercising judgement over Solar Field permits. Currently counties can not "Yeah" or "Nay" a project. Local government can only exercise oversight of buffers and landscape. The proposals will remove the pre-emption.

<u>Regional Emergency Shelters</u> – DEM Director Kevin Guthrie presented in several committees on the impact and costs of the hurricanes this year. A major point made during his presentation was a discussion regarding the potential of "regional" shelters that would give additional capacity to respond and shelter folks in rural areas. More to follow on this!

<u>Property Tax Exemption - HJR 359 - Expansion of Property Tax Exemptions</u> – this legislative provides a wide range of exemption from property tax including a new \$100,000 exemption from assessed value of real property for all levies. Any expansion of property tax exemption must be accompanied by an Offset for Fiscally Constrained counties.
