Release of Governor's Budget Proposal for FY 25-26 February 2, 2025, is the date for the release.

The Governor's Budget proposal for FY 25-26 should be released Feb. 2, 2025 - 30 days before the beginning of the legislative session - The governor uses the LBRs to make a <u>budget recommendation</u>. The governor presents a recommended budget to the Legislature. This budget promotes the governor's key issues and priorities. The legislative session will convene on Tuesday, March 4, 2025.
