HB 703 -Shifts Cost of Relocating Utilities to Local Govt. –up on Monday Staff Analysis for HB 703

Bill Proposes mandating that public entities pay for Broadband Utility Relocation

Monday, April 7th at 3:00 PM - 214 House Office Building House Commerce Committee HB 703 by Rep. Will Robinson is a bill that would make state and local governments, including counties, pay the costs of moving broadband, cable, and video service lines instead of the private companies that own them. The Senate companion has two more committees. This bill will have a significant impact on the cost of roadwork requiring local governments and the state to pay for costs to move the lines associated with broadband.

**State Affairs Committee** 

This proposal is a statewide vote to implement term-limits in every county of the state. Your county does not want anyone other than the voters is your county to dictate the number of times an individual can offer themselves to serve the public.

This proposal is a hard cap at 8 years – you can't sit out and run again!

#### State Affairs Committee Email Addresses

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HJR 679 and SJR 302 propose a constitutional amendment implementing 8 year Term Limits for Members of County Commissions and District School Boards. Significant concerns have been raised regarding having a statewide vote where every county would be subservient to the results of the vote. We have requested that any proposal provide the local electorate in each county to determine the issue for their own county and not a statewide dictate. The Senate bill seems stalled – the House bill has one more committee. The committees are hearing testimony opposing the proposal.

- Increased Settlement Caps \$200K to \$1 million and \$300K to \$3 million will Impact Cost of Liability Insurance
- Authority to settle over caps will eliminate elements of review and have unintended consequences.

The proposal increases statutory limits on liability for tort claims against state & its agencies & subdivisions; authorizes subdivision to settle claim in excess of statutory limit without legislative action regardless of insurance coverage limits; prohibits insurance policy from conditioning benefits on enactment of claim bill; specifies that limitations in effect on date claim accrues apply to that claim; revises period within which certain claims must be presented; revises exceptions relating to instituting tort claimsovs against state or agencies or subdivisions; revises period after which failure of certain entities to make final disposition of claim shall be deemed final denial of claim for

certain purposes; revises statute of limitations for tort claims against state or one of its agencies or subdivisions & exceptions.
