Kicked-off last evening with a reception, Rural County Days will hold its signature event with exhibits and an Old Time Fish Fry between Florida's Old and New Capitol!

Legislative Briefings were held for County Commissioners by the Florida Association of Counties and the Small County Coalition and by the Small School District Council Consortium and the Florida School Boards Association for School Officials.

Senate President Albritton Welcomes the Small County Coalition and the Small School District Council Consortium to the Senate Chambers

Yesterday – Senate President held a special briefing for small county commissioners and small school district officials in the Senate Chamber where he discussed the "Rural Renaissance". The participants were led in the Chamber by Commissioner Russell Melendy, Chair of the Small County Coalition and a commissioner from Hardee County – Albritton's home county. When Senator Albritton entered the Chamber he met Commissioner Melendy with a huge body crushing Bear Hug! Albritton and Melendy are lifetime residents of Wauchula – and are good

friends. It was an important event where the President shared his love for the people of rural Florida.

Rural Renassance Bill SB 110 Passes Senate

The proposal is the most comprehensive piece of legislation that has ever been considered by the Florida Legislature. Initiatives addressing health care, education, funding for rural communities, law enforcement and more are included with a commitment of \$200 million dollars targeting these issues.

Bills moving this week. Solar Facilities – SB 1304 passed its first committee.

The Bill sponsored by Jennifer Bradley returns county oversite and decommissioning legislation. Speakers from Clay, DeSoto, Columbia, Gilchrist and others spoke in favor of the bill.

School Start Times moving in the House and Senate

The bill repealing the school start time mandate is moving in both the House and Senate. Bills repeal the later start time mandates are moving in both the House and Senate. It appears the legislation has strong head wins.

Term Limits

Yesterday the House Intergovernmental Affairs committee heard HB 679 which proposes a Constitutional amendment establishing eight year term limits for county commissioners and school board members. The bill was opposed by dozens of speakers. The bill passed the committee. The bill proposes a statewide vote. A statewide vote would be dominated by voters from counties that already have term-limits.
