#### <u>Sine Die!</u>

It's almost 10:00pm The Speaker has just announced that the session will be extended. House Concurrent Resolution 1631 has been filed, extending the 2025 legislative session until 11:59 p.m. on Friday, June 6, 2025.

The legislature may only consider the General Appropriations Act, Implementing bills, and Conforming Bills.

All other measures in both houses are indefinitely postponed and withdrawn from consideration of the respective house as of 12:00 a.m., Saturday, May 3, 2025.

Speaker Perez, on the Floor, announced that the budget conference committees and the schedule will be announced next week, and that members should plan to be back in Tallahassee the Week of May 12th for Conference committee meetings.

HB 1631 - Extension of the 2025 Regular Session of the Legislature From the text of the bill:
