# A Status on Where We Are!

- Friday May 2 The 60 day regular session was extended through June 6. The Extension was based on the "framework" of an agreement between the Senate President and the House Speaker on \$2.8 billion in tax cuts, , including a .25% reduction of the state sales tax.
- Wednesday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, Governor DeSantis announced he will veto a reduction in the sales tax.
- Friday, May 9 Agreement of the Tax Reduction Proposal goes "off the rails".
  - Based on Governor's Veto threat, President Albritton withdraws his support for reducing the sales tax.
  - Speaker Perez expresses displeasure and indicates his intention to convene the House of Representatives to approve extending the Session through June 30<sup>th</sup>.
  - Senate Responds that an additional extension through June 30<sup>th</sup> is not needed while the current June 6<sup>th</sup> extension is in play.
- As of today (Saturday) The House and Senate leadership have continued to exchange proposals, however, there is no agreement.
- Tuesday May 13 the House is scheduled to convene to consider Resolution to extend session.
- Tuesday May 13 the House Select Committee on Property Taxes will meet at 1:00pm to continue discussion on property tax reduction proposals.

- Senate President Albritton is not convening the Senate into Session this week.
- There will be no progress until there is agreement on the Tax Plan and then the Budget will be negotiated.
- The Senate Proposed Budget SB 2500 is \$4.7 billion higher than the House Proposal.

- SB 110 **Rural Renaissance** Senate President Priority As of this passed Friday Speaker Perez has indicated that this proposal is in trouble. Nothing is over until it is!!
- SB 2500 The General Appropriations Act Includes all spending general operating and capital outlay.
- SB 2510 Reduction of Program Weights within the FEFP. -
- HB 7033 Tax Package includes:
  - **Repeal Tourist Development Councils and Funding transferred** to the County Commission – 75% of the TDT funds transferred are mandated for property tax relief.
  - Repeal of authority to Opt Out of Affordable Housing Property Tax Exemption
  - Sales Tax Reduction Speaker Supports Governor opposes.
