### Budget Comments for the Small School Districts

- The provisions that provide equalization and support for small counties are in both the House and Senate - Compression of the Discretionary local effort is provided; the Comparative Wage Factor (the old DCD) is leveled up to 1.0 for all districts; the Small District Factor is continued and even increased in the House proposal.
- The House rolls back the Required Local Effort while the Senate maintains millage rates. The House rollback reduces potential funding by \$70 million.
- There is no funding in the House for the Special Facility Construction projects. The Senate fully funds the requested amounts.

- **SAFE SCHOOLS FORMULA CHANGE HURTS SMALL DISTRICTS** The House is proposing an increase of \$158 million in Safe Schools funding – however the House is proposing a new formula based on number of SRO to number of schools. The formula also eliminates base funding leaving 14 small districts with less funding. **Eliminating the base in the formula is a major concern. We will need to work to protect the base funding element of the formula that benefit the smalls.** The following districts will actually receive less safe schools funding under the House proposal -
- The Senate has included a provision to address the current year enrollment drop – the House has not.
- The Senate has included a declining enrollment provision for the FY 26-27 year.
- The Senate has increased the per member funding for the Regional Educational Consortium members. Not in the House.
- The Senate has provided \$25 million for a Rural District Supplemental Services program making allocations to the three regional consortia for distribution.
- The funding for the Regional Educational Consortia increased in the Senate – not so in the House.
- Rural School District Supplemental Services Grant Program - \$25 million is appropriated in the Senate to the three regional consortia to distribute to their members to support their members for Supplemental Services.

#### **COMMENTS FOR SMALL COUNTIES BUDGET ITEMS**

- Both the House and Senate budgets provide level funding for the small county grant programs.
  - Small County Road Programs increased in the Senate down by \$12 million in the House.
  - All of the constitutional offsets for Fiscally Constrained counties are funded at recommended levels.
  - Aerial Photography funding for small counties is funded.
  - Revenue sharing programs – Emergency Distribution and Supplemental are funded.
  - PILT programs funded at current levels. No increases for legislative changes in the program.
  - Wastewater; Recycling; Mosquito Control; Oyster Planting; Rural Hospitals; and DEM grants funded.
  - Economic Development Programs differ in Senate and House.
    - **Job Growth program funded at \$50 million in Senate – Not funded in the House.**
    - Office of Rural Affairs is funded in the Senate – Not in the House.
    - Visit Florida funded at \$80,000,000 in both Senate and House.
